The Department of Afro-American Studies seeks a dynamic, energetic leader with the ability to effectively serve and engage faculty, staff, students, and external constituencies in a collegial and collaborative manner. The Chair will have a strong record of excellence in teaching, research, and scholarship in "disciplinary Africana Studies," an intellectual project that engages and narrates the fullness of Africana humanity in time and space while utilizing internal frames of reference and cultural experiences of African people to generate theory that discerns linkages, continuities, discontinuities, repetition of normative categories, and improvisations among African people in the face of episodic challenges.

The Chair will also have an extensive background in working in a department/program dedicated to Africana Studies, and preferred demonstrated strong collegial academic leadership, faculty development, fundraising, and financial management.

This is an outstanding opportunity for a creative colleague to join a faculty in one of the country's few Africana Studies departments comprised primarily of holders of PhDs in the discipline, at a critical time in the life of the Department, College, and University. The Chair represents the Department as part of the college's leadership team and is responsible for the Department's faculty and staff recruiting, development, retention, resource attainment, financial management, and stakeholder relationships. The Chair manages a diverse faculty, staff and student body, and leads the Department in strong scholarship, teaching capacity, and outreach.

The Chair must be an active intellectual leader, adept at building and supporting multidisciplinary partnerships within a diverse community, knowledgeable in higher education issues, collaborative in developing team-focused, data-driven approaches to problem solving, and possess strong people-skills. Working in partnership with the senior administration of the College of Arts & Science, the successful candidate will be expected to embrace and contribute to the mission of the University.

- Earned doctorate or terminal degree from an accredited institution; PhD in African American Studies strong preferred, but allied disciplines will be considered;
- Record of professional accomplishments and scholarship that meet the qualifications for appointment to the rank of professor in the college;
- Strong and sustained record of teaching excellence and interdisciplinary initiatives;
- Strong and sustained record of research and creative accomplishments;
- Administrative, personnel and budgetary experience at the department level;
- Evidence of a strong commitment to helping students obtain a broad-based education;
- Evidence in curriculum development including a commitment to collaboration and innovative pedagogies;
- Evidence of strong interpersonal and communication skills with faculty, staff, students, alumni, and community members;
- Demonstrated ability to manage a complex academic organization and work effectively with colleagues across divisions;
- Evidence of effective community involvement, outreach, leadership, and demonstrated ability to forge partnerships and build productive relationships with both campus and external constituencies including alumni; and
- Demonstrated commitment to student centeredness and optimization of student learning.
