As the Department of Art prepares for its centennial celebration, it seeks a dynamic, energetic leader with a demonstrated track record of excellence in research, creative production, and instruction in studio arts as well as historically contextualizing visual culture to effectively engage university faculty, staff, students, and external constituencies. The growth of the department anticipates the advancement of the visual art programs — art history, ceramics, design, electronic studio, fashion design, interior design, painting, photography, and sculpture — and its overall academic impact for the next one hundred years and beyond. The Chair position serves as the department administrator as well as a member of the faculty expected to be an artist and/or visual arts scholar engaged in creative production and/or scholarship, committed to teaching and learning, professional development, and service. In additions to having a strong record of excellence in academic leadership, the prospective Chair shall possess experience and/or knowledge in staff/faculty evaluation and development, and budgetary and fiscal management, fundraising/grant writing, and navigating facilities operations and maintenance in accordance with OSHA regulations.

The Chair represents the Department as part of the college's leadership team and is responsible for but not limited to faculty and staff recruitment, development, retention, resource attainment, financial management, and creating and maintaining strategic management with stakeholders.

An active intellectual leader, the Chair must be adept at building and supporting multidisciplinary partnerships within a diverse community, knowledgeable in higher education issues, collaborative in developing team-focused, data-driven approaches to problem solving, and possess strong interpersonal and communication-skills.

The successful candidate shall work in partnership with the senior administration of the College of Fine Arts and the University to embrace as well as contribute to the mission, vision, and values of the Department, College, and University.

The Department is NASAD accredited and consists of 17 tenured, tenure-track, master teacher, and adjunct faculty members. It offers the B.A., B.F.A. and M.F.A. degrees with concentrations in Art History, Ceramics, Fashion Design, Graphic Design, Interior Design, Electronic Studio, Painting, Photography, and Sculpture.

- Earned doctorate or terminal degree from an accredited institution: Ph.D. or M.F.A.
 from an accredited institution, in one of, or a combination of, any of the concentration
 areas offered by the Department, but allied disciplines will be considered;
- Knowledge of, experience in, and critical appreciation of all areas and concentrations
 offered by the Department and of the technologies that support new modes of
 teaching and learning;
- National recognition for creative and/or scholarly expertise;
- A strong and sustained record of professional accomplishments and scholarship that meet the qualifications for appointment to the rank of professor in the college;
- A strong and sustained record of teaching excellence and interdisciplinary and/or interdisciplinary initiatives;
- Experience in the development and management of in-person, online, and hybrid academic programs in the visual arts, including administrative, personnel, and budgetary experience at the department level;

- Demonstrated ability to manage a complex academic organization and work
 effectively with colleagues across schools, colleges, research centers and other unites
 on campus in person and remotely;
- Evidence of a commitment to and success securing external funding through grants and fundraising;
- Evidence of strong interpersonal and communication skills with faculty, staff, students, alumni, and community members to foster and maintain a healthy, creative, and productive environment among faculty, staff, and students and positive relationships with partners;
- Evidence of recruitment and retention of a diverse faculty and staff, as well as teambuilding, supervision, and staff support for professional development;
- Commitment to shared governance;
- Evidence in curriculum development, including a commitment to collaboration and innovative pedagogies;
- Demonstrated commitment to student centeredness and optimization of student learning; and
- Evidence of effective community involvement, outreach, leadership, and demonstrated ability to forge partnerships and build productive relationships with both campus and external constituencies including alumni.

Procedure for Candidacy

This is an outstanding opportunity for a creative leader at an exciting time in the continued growth of the Department, College, and University. The position is a 12-month appointment with a three-year term. The salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.
