Course Description: This tailored study abroad program serves as a lens through which students can analyze issues relevant to the history of France, its (neo)colonial, and socio-cultural connections to the French island of Guadeloupe. It aims to acquaint students with the experiences, beliefs, values, and voices that are instrumental in shaping Guadeloupe. Students will closely examine the impact of climatic, environmental, cultural, and geopolitical diversity, as well as the complexities surrounding class, religion, race, gender, age, and their influence on daily life, as well as the driving forces behind present-day policies and practices in Guadeloupe.
