Course Description: This course, Energy and Environmental Justice (EJ), is an active learning study abroad course. For the first several weeks of the course before departure, students will learn about South Africa's history, society, culture, politics, economy, geography, and its place in world affairs. You will also learn about energy and EJ. Energy is important to study in an Environmental Studies course because it is the largest contributor to climate change, while at the same time it is essential to life. Currently, over 600 million Africans do not have access to modern, affordable, and reliable energy. Energy poverty is among the factors holding back Africa's development. South Africa has a modern energy infrastructure, but it is fraught with a number of inadequacies. In this course, we will learn how South Africa is working to meet the energy needs of its citizens while addressing climate and environmental concerns.
