- **Your Degree Breakdown:**
- Major Requirements: 39+ Psychology credits (13+ courses)
- Minor Requirements: 15-18 credits, 2.0 GPA (5 – 6 courses)
- General Education: 60+ credits (approximately 24 courses)
- Math Requirements: 3-4 credits (1 course)
- Free Electives: Remaining credits to reach 120 (varies by track)
- Complete all 7 ELOs (can overlap with courses)
- COAS Experiential Learning (1 course) & COAS Innovative Learning (1 course)
- Undergraduate Comprehensive Exam

Important: Double-Dipping Made Simple!

One course can fulfill BOTH a General Education requirement AND an Essential Learning Outcome (ELO) at the same time. You don't need separate courses for each! This helps you graduate efficiently without taking extra classes.

Major credits **cannot** be double dipped with minor credits. Minors require **15–18 credits that are not applied to their major requirements**. Minor coursework must remain distinct and separate from major coursework.

General Education Requirements (60+ Credits)

Students must complete courses covering all seven outcome areas. Remember, these can overlap with other requirements!

Key Requirements

- **Minimum Major GPA:** 2.0
- **Minimum Minor GPA:** 2.0
- **Credits in Psychology:** 39 minimum (including orientation, foundation, research/stats sequence, 4 core domains, 3 electives, and capstone)
- **Foreign Language:** 6 credits in the same language required
- **Mathematics:** MATH 005 or higher (3-4 credits)
- **Statistics Sequence:** PSYC 003 and PSYC 004 required for all majors
- **Residency:** Last 30 credits at Howard University
- **General Education:** Must span at least 4 different disciplines

Important Notes

- **New Student Orientation:** PSYC 016 is required for all new Psychology majors and should be taken in the first semester.
- **Research & Statistics:** The PSYC 002, 003, and 004 sequence provides essential quantitative and research skills. Should be complete by end of sophomore year.
- **Core Content Domains:** Choose 4 courses from approved Psychology core domains (e.g., Developmental, Social, Cognitive, Biological, Clinical). Consult with your advisor about domain requirements.
- **Foreign Language:** All 6 credits must be in the same language. Complete consecutively.
- **Experiential Learning:** Can be satisfied through research assistantships, internships, practicum courses, or study abroad. Plan early with your advisor.
- **Capstone Seminar:** PSYC 011 integrates your learning and should be taken in your final year.
- **Course Sequencing:** Many upper-level PSYC courses require PSYC 001 and PSYC-002 as a prerequisite. Some may also require completion of statistics courses.
- **Graduate School Preparation:** Students planning for graduate school should consider additional research experience and advanced coursework in their area of interest.
- Consult with your academic advisor each semester for course planning.
