#### **Important: Double-Dipping Made Simple!**

One course can fulfill BOTH a General Education requirement AND an Essential Learning Outcome (ELO) at the same time. You don't need separate courses for each! This helps you graduate efficiently without taking extra classes.

Major credits **cannot** be double dipped with minor credits. Minors require **15–18 credits that are not applied to their major requirements**. Minor coursework must remain distinct and separate from major coursework.

# **Key Requirements**

- Minimum Major GPA: 2.0
- Minimum Minor GPA: 2.0
- Credits in Political Science: 36 minimum (15 core + 3 methods + 15 electives + 3 internship)
- Foreign Language: 9 credits in the same language required
- Minor Required: 15 credits in a different department,
- Mathematics: 6-8 credits of MATH courses PLUS POLS (quantitative reasoning)
- Residency: Last 30 credits at Howard University

# **Important Notes**

- Minor Requirement: Political Science majors must complete a 15-credit minor in a different department. Choose your minor carefully during your first year. Need 2.0 GPA
- **Quantitative Skills:** POLS requires 6 math credits PLUS POLS 002 (Research Methods) for quantitative reasoning preparation.
- Foreign Language: All 9 credits must be in the same language.
- Internship: POLS internship course provides experiential learning and professional development. Plan for this in your junior year.
- **Flexible Electives:** Use your 12 flexible elective credits strategically they can explore interests or strengthen your resume.
- **Course Sequencing:** Some upper-level POLS courses may have prerequisites. Review course descriptions carefully.
- Consult with your academic advisor each semester for course planning.
