- COAS Experiential Learning (2 courses) & COAS Innovative Learning (1 course)

Important: Double-Dipping Made Simple!

One course can fulfill BOTH a General Education requirement AND an Essential Learning Outcome (ELO) at the same time. You don't need separate courses for each! This helps you graduate efficiently without taking extra classes.

Major credits **cannot** be double dipped with minor credits. While students are not required to declare a minor, those who choose to do so must complete **15–18 credits that are not applied toward their major requirements**. Minor coursework must remain distinct and separate from major coursework.

University-Wide Requirements

- Minimum GPA:** 2.0 for all undergraduate coursework
- Residency:** Complete last 30 credits at Howard University

- ❑ **Exit Requirement:** Undergraduate Comprehensive Exam
- ❑ **Total Credits:** 120 credits required

- One Colloquium in any field of study: Pre-Law, Africa, African Diaspora, Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean, Public History or United States (3 credits)

History Seminar Course (3 credits/ 1 Course)

- One Seminar in any field of study: Pre-Law, Africa, African Diaspora, Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean, Public History or United States (3 credits)

History of Africa or the African Diaspora Course (3 credits/ 1 Course)

- One Course (Lecture, Colloquium or Seminar) on the history of Africa or the African Diaspora (3 credits)

Pre-Law/Europe/Latin America/Public History Course (3 credits/ 1 Course)

- One course (lecture, colloquia or seminar) in Pre-Law, Europe, Latin America, or Public History (3 credits)

Take five additional courses in any field of study and at any level (lecture, colloquium, seminar)

Key Requirements

- **Minimum Major GPA:** 2.0
- **Credits in History: 30+ minimum** (including foundation, major electives, seminar, and senior colloquium)
- **Foreign Language:** 9 credits in the same language required
- **Mathematics:** MATH 005 or higher (3-4 credits)
- **Residency:** Last 30 credits at Howard University
- **General Education:** Must span at least 4 different disciplines

Important Notes

- **Introduction to History:** HIST 003 is required for all History majors and should be taken in the first semester.
- **Senior Colloquium:** HIST 082 integrates your learning and should be taken in your final year.
- **Seminar Course:** Complete the required BA in History Seminar Course to develop advanced research and writing skills.
- **Foreign Language:** All 9 credits must be in the same language. Complete consecutively.
- **Experiential Learning:** Two courses required. Can be satisfied through research assistantships, internships, practicum courses, or study abroad. Plan early with your advisor.
- **Course Sequencing:** Many upper-level HIST courses require HIST 003 as a prerequisite. Plan accordingly.
- **Graduate School Preparation:** Students planning for graduate school should consider additional research experience and advanced coursework in their area of interest.
- Consult with your academic advisor each semester for course planning.
