- Free Electives: Remaining credits to reach 120 (varies by track)

### Important: Double-Dipping Made Simple!

One course can fulfill BOTH a General Education requirement AND an Essential Learning Outcome (ELO) at the same time. You don't need separate courses for each! This helps you graduate efficiently without taking extra classes.

Major credits **cannot** be double dipped with minor credits. Minors require **15–18 credits that are not applied to their major requirements**. Minor coursework must remain distinct and separate from major coursework.

## University-Wide Requirements

- Minimum GPA:** 2.0 for all undergraduate coursework
- Residency:** Complete last 30 credits at Howard University
- Exit Requirement:** Undergraduate Comprehensive Exam
- Total Credits:** 120 credits required

## Key Requirements

- **Minimum Major GPA:** 2.0
- **Minimum Minor GPA:** 2.0
- **Credits in Philosophy:** 36 minimum (15 core + 3 methods + 15 electives + 3 internship)
- **Foreign Language:** 9 credits in the same language required
- **Minor Required:** 15-18 credits in a different department,
- **Mathematics:** 3-4 credits of MATH 005 or higher
- **Residency:** Last 30 credits at Howard University
- **General Education:** Must span at least 4 different disciplines

## Important Notes

- **Minor Requirement:** Philosophy majors must complete a 15-18 credit minor in a different department. Choose your minor carefully during your first year. Need 2.0 GPA
- **Classical Ethics:** PHIL 110 provides foundational knowledge and should be taken early.
- **Symbolic Logic:** PHIL 175 develops critical reasoning skills essential for philosophy.
- **Africana Philosophy:** PHIL 179 explores philosophy from African and African American perspectives.
- **Senior Thesis:** PHIL 200 is the capstone project demonstrating mastery of philosophical inquiry.
- **Foreign Language:** All 9 credits must be in the same language.

- **Graduate Preparation:** Philosophy prepares students for law school and many graduate programs.
- Consult with your academic advisor each semester for course planning.
