Your Degree Breakdown:

- Major Requirements: 36 English credits (12 courses)

- Complete all 7 ELOs (can overlap with courses)
- Experiential Learning Course & Innovative Learning Requirement

Creative Writing Concentration: Students may complete ENGL 298 - Creative Writing Thesis

Important: Double-Dipping Made Simple!

One course can fulfill BOTH a General Education requirement AND an Essential Learning Outcome (ELO) at the same time. You don't need separate courses for each! This helps you graduate efficiently without taking extra classes.

Major credits **cannot** be double dipped with minor credits. Minors require **15-18 credits that are not applied to their major requirements**. Minor coursework must remain distinct and separate from major coursework.

University-Wide Requirements

- **Minimum GPA:** 2.0 for all undergraduate coursework
- **Residency:** Complete last 30 credits at Howard University
- **Exit Requirement:** Undergraduate Comprehensive Exam
- **Total Credits:** 120 credits required

General Education Requirements (30 Credits / ~15 Courses)

Key Requirements

- **Minimum Major GPA:** 2.0
- **Credits in English:** 36 minimum
- **Foreign Language:** 9 credits in the same language required
- **Mathematics:** MATH 005 or higher required
- **Residency:** Last 30 credits at Howard University
- **General Education:** Must span at least 4 different disciplines

Important Notes

- **Sophomore Seminars:** ENGL 104 and ENGL 105 should be taken in the second year.
- **Foundation Courses:** Complete all four foundations (Linguistic, African American, American, British).
- **Creative Writing:** Must complete 4 creative writing electives. Students interested may complete ENGL 298 - Creative Writing Thesis.
- **Foreign Language:** All 9 credits must be in the same language.
- **Minimum Minor GPA:** 2.0 **if declared** (15 credits minimum)
- **Graduate Preparation:** Consider research opportunities and advanced coursework.
- Consult with your academic advisor each semester for course planning.
