- Free Electives: Remaining credits to reach 120 (varies by track)
- Complete all 7 ELOs (can overlap with courses)
- COAS Experiential (1 course) & COAS Innovative Learning (1 course)
- Undergraduate Comprehensive Exam

### Important: Double-Dipping Made Simple!

One course can fulfill BOTH a General Education requirement AND an Essential Learning Outcome (ELO) at the same time. You don't need separate courses for each! This helps you graduate efficiently without taking extra classes.

Major credits **cannot** be double dipped with minor credits. Minors require **15–18 credits that are not applied to their major requirements**. Minor coursework must remain distinct and separate from major coursework.

## University-Wide Requirements

- Minimum GPA:** 2.0 for all undergraduate coursework
- Residency:** Complete last 30 credits at Howard University
- Exit Requirement:** Undergraduate Comprehensive Exam
- Total Credits:** 120 credits required

## General Education Requirements (30 Credits / ~15 Courses)

### Essential Learning Outcomes (ELOs)

Students must complete courses covering all seven outcome areas. Remember, these can overlap with other requirements!

- ELO 1:** U.S. and Global African Diasporic Developments
- ELO 2:** Human Cultures and Creative Expression
- ELO 3:** The Physical and Natural World
- ELO 4:** Intellectual and Practical Skills
- ELO 5:** Social Responsibility and Political Institutions
- ELO 6:** Leadership and Applied Learning
- ELO 7:** Comprehensive Wellness Practices

- **FRSM 001** - Freshman Seminar (1 credit)

### Core Writing & Communication (12 Credits / 4 Courses)

- ENGW 102, or 104** - First-Year English Writing I (3 credits)
  - If you take ENGW 102, then you take ENGW 103. If you take ENGW 104, then you take ENGW 105
- ENGW 103 or 105** - First-Year English Writing II (3 credits)
- Third Writing Course** - Upper-level writing (3 credits)
- COMM 101**- Principles of Speech (3 credits)

## **Mathematics (3-4 Credits / 1 Course)**

- **Any MATH 005 or higher** - College Algebra I or higher (3-4 credits)

## **Health & Wellness (2 Credits/ 2 Courses)**

1-2 courses needed (2 credits)

- **One-Two HHPL Course** - Health, Human Performance, and Leisure (2 credits)

## **Cultural and Global Awareness (15 Credits / 5 Courses)**

- **African American Cluster Course** - (3 credits)
- **Foreign Language** - 4 courses (12 credits total, same language)
  - COAS requires 3 semesters, major requires a fourth semester

## **Humanities, Social Science & Philosophy (24 Credits / 8 courses)**

- **Four Humanities Courses** - (3 credits each)
  - Different from major courses
- **Three Social Science Courses** - (3 credits each)
- **Philosophy Elective** (3 credits)
  - PHIL 051/053/055/057/ or 059

## **Natural Sciences (9-12 Credits / 3 Courses)**

- **Three Natural Science Courses** (9-12 credits)
  - At least 2 different departments

## **General Electives**

- **4 courses in different general education disciplines** (12 credits)

## **COAS Special Requirements**

### **Experiential Learning (1 course required)**

Examples of COAS Experiential Learning Course but are not limited to:

- Internship (ECON, POLS, SOCI)

- Any 890 course
- Study abroad

## Key Requirements

- **Minimum Major GPA:** 2.0
- **Minor GPA:** 2.0 (separate courses from major)
- **Credits in Community Development:** 30 minimum
- **Foreign Language:** 12 credits in the same language required
- **Mathematics:** 3-4 credits of MATH 005 or higher
- **Residency:** Last 30 credits at Howard University

- **Graduate Preparation:** Consider research opportunities and advanced coursework.
- Consult with your academic advisor each semester for course planning.
